Here's how a social services specialist is nurturing a culture of girls supporting girls at Aldo Leopold Intermediate School and beyond.

Every Tuesday and Thursday during the lunch hour, Cree Webb's office at Aldo Leopold Intermediate School fills with fifth- and sixth-grade girls skipping recess for Girls Group.

Lunch trays in hand, they pick a spot. For some, it's the couch in the far north corner. Others prefer one of the three tables nearest the door. Some settle into bean bag chairs and others sit criss-cross applesauce on rugs.

"This is their safe space," Webb said. "I tried to make it as girly in here as possible."

Seated below twinkle lights and a blanket-turned-banner displaying messages of self-acceptance and grace, the girls dig into their lunch as Webb launches into the day's discussion. On this particular day, self-love was the topic.

Iowa Education for Deaf and Blind The Drive for Independence

The drive for independence

Driver's education teacher Beth Chadwick shrugs and laughs when asked about her courage level. "I've got a brake on my side of the car, and I make use of it!"

At Iowa School for the Deaf, she has taught subjects from English to graphic arts but says driver's education may be her favorite because of what it does for a student's sense of independence.

Chadwick says learning to drive is a milestone many of her students feared they'd never reach. Parents are more apprehensive to teach their child to drive when language barriers exist between them.

Most parents of ISD students are hearing and may not communicate with their child in sign language to the depth necessary to understand rules of the road. Chadwick has students who have never sat in the driver's seat at home before because parents are hesitant. "How do you give feedback to a child who can't hear you?" she said.

FOR STUDENTS WHO ARE DEAF OR HARD OF HEARING, LANGUAGE BARRIERS ARE GENERALLY THE LARGEST HURDLE TO CLEAR IN EARNING A DRIVER'S PERMIT, REGARDLESS OF WHERE THEY ATTEND SCHOOL.

"Knowing vocabulary and concepts like 'lane' and 'parallel parking' can make the difference between success and failure when trying to get a driving permit," Chadwick said.

"I teach the signs I'll use before we ever go out on the road. When we get into the car, I reach into their field of vision with my left hand to demonstrate, 'Stay in your lane. Turn left. Slow down.'"

It's different at Iowa School for the Deaf, because Chadwick explains unfamiliar terminology and gets concepts across that might have been difficult to grasp in another setting. Some vocabulary and legal terminology

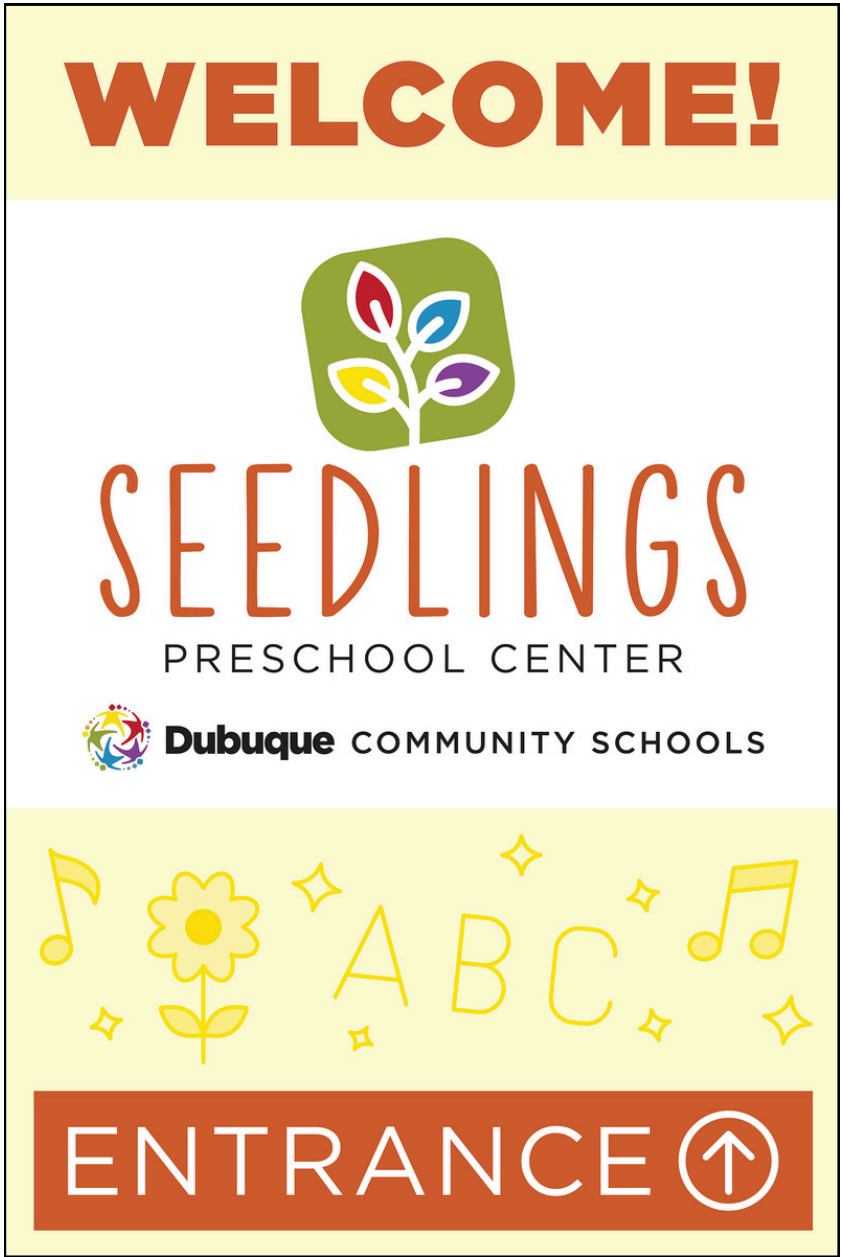

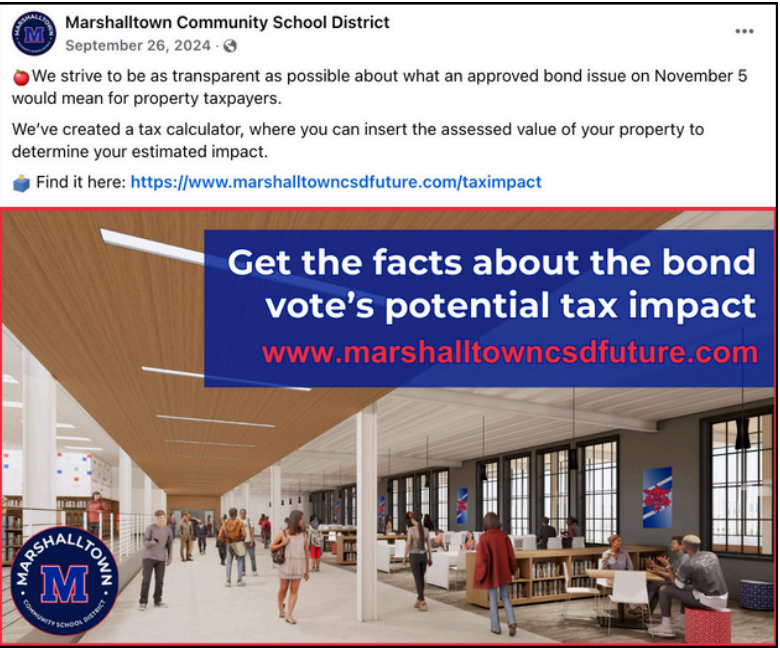

IMPACT ON LOCAL PROPERTY TAXES
MARSHALLTOWN BOND VOTE

BACKGROUND

B.R. Miller Middle School has served generations of students for the Marshalltown Community School District and has been a source of immense pride for nearly a century. But the needs today of students and staff and the expectations of public education have changed dramatically since MMS opened its doors.

Among the many challenges MCSD faces today when it comes to MMS is inadequate safety measures and security systems, limited technology capabilities, and a lack of space for learning, gathering, and new programming. That's why the district explored bold and innovative solutions that respect the storied past of MMS while also looking to the future.

On Tuesday, November 5, 2024, our community will consider a \$57 million bond referendum. If this is approved by at least 60% of voters, MCSD will move forward with a series of improvements at Miller that reimagine the historic facility for generations to come.

HOW IS THE TAX IMPACT CALCULATED?

Calculating the tax impact can be a little complicated due to the state rollback and Homestead Credit. Below is a five-step process to provide some clarification:

1
Let's say we have a home with an assessed value of \$200,000.

2
Factor in the 46.34% state rollback. This gives us a taxable value of \$92,680 on the home.

3
Subtract the Homestead Credit of \$4,850. This gives us a net taxable value of \$87,830.

4
Multiply the net taxable value by the levy rate increase of \$1.28. The calculation looks like this:
 $\$87,830 \times .00128 = \112.42

5
This equals \$112.42 (or \$9.37 per month) per \$200,000 of assessed home value.

WHAT ABOUT AGRICULTURAL PROPERTY?

For agricultural property, the tax impact of the bond issue is calculated per acre.

County	Avg. Assessed Value per Acre	State Rollback	Taxable Value	Levy Rate Increase	Change in Annual Tax per Acre
Marshall County	\$2,168	x 71.8370%	= \$1,557	x .00128	= \$1.99

MARSHALLTOWN CSD SCHOOL BOARD APPROVES BOND REFERENDUM FOR NOVEMBER 5 BALLOT

The Marshalltown Community School District School Board has approved a \$57 million bond referendum that will appear on the ballot Tuesday, November 5, 2024.

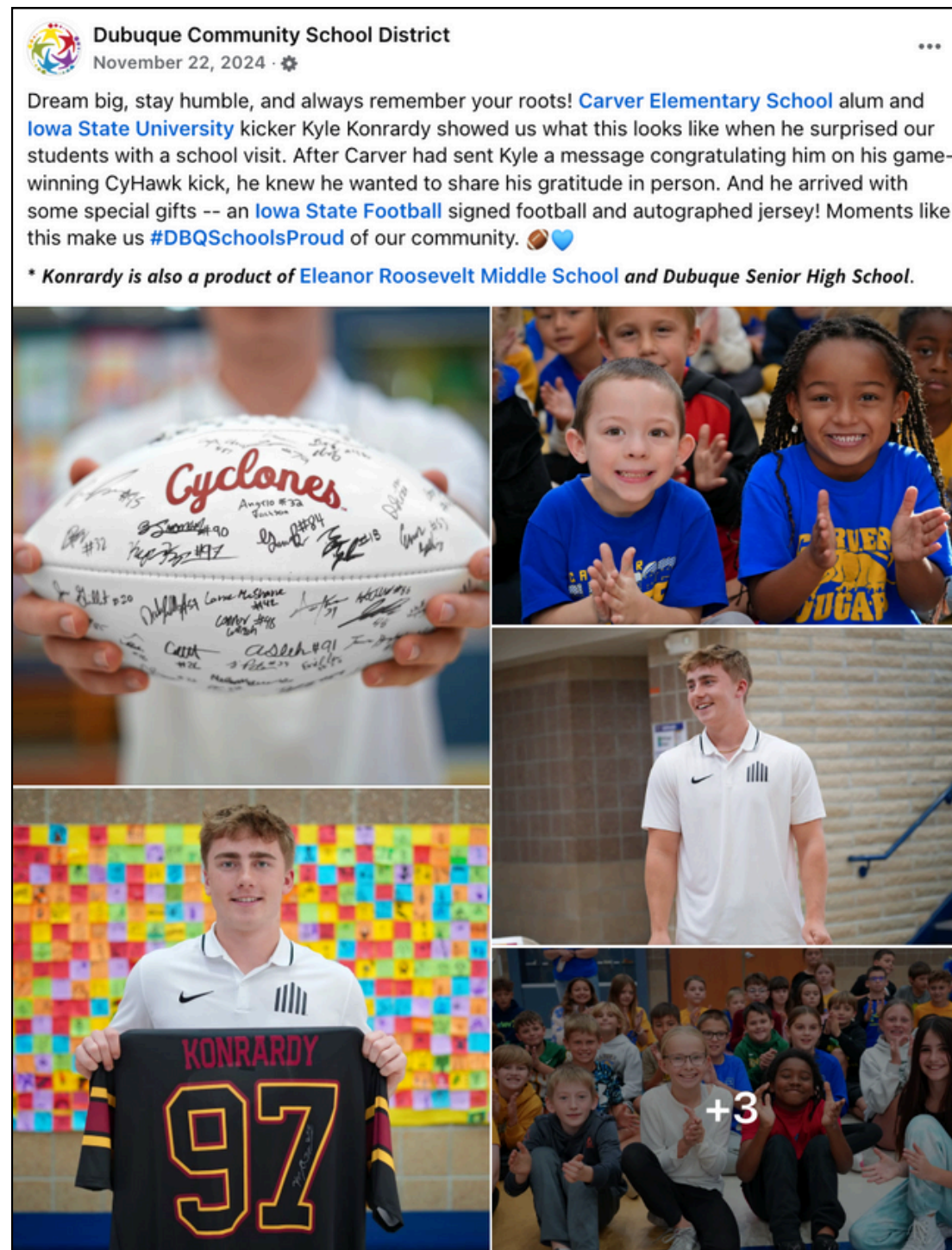
Petitions asking the board to place the bond question on the ballot circulated in the community over the past several weeks. After it received the required number of signatures from eligible voters, the petition was verified by MCSD staff and formally filed with the School Board for its consideration.

Bond referendums require at least 60% approval from voters to pass. Funds provided by a successful referendum in November would be used in conjunction with revenue that MCSD receives from the statewide one-cent sales tax fund known as Secure an Advanced Vision for Education ([SAVE](#)) to finance the project.

"We want to thank our community members for their effort with the petition," said Superintendent Dr. Theron Schutte. "The board's decision now means our residents will have the opportunity to consider a bond referendum that, if approved this November, would reimagine Miller Middle School for future generations of students."

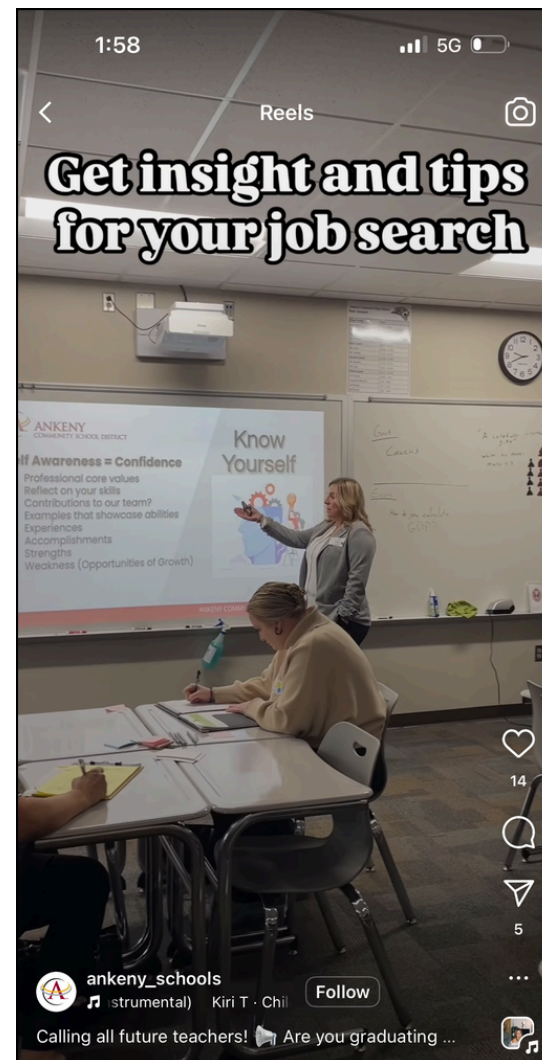

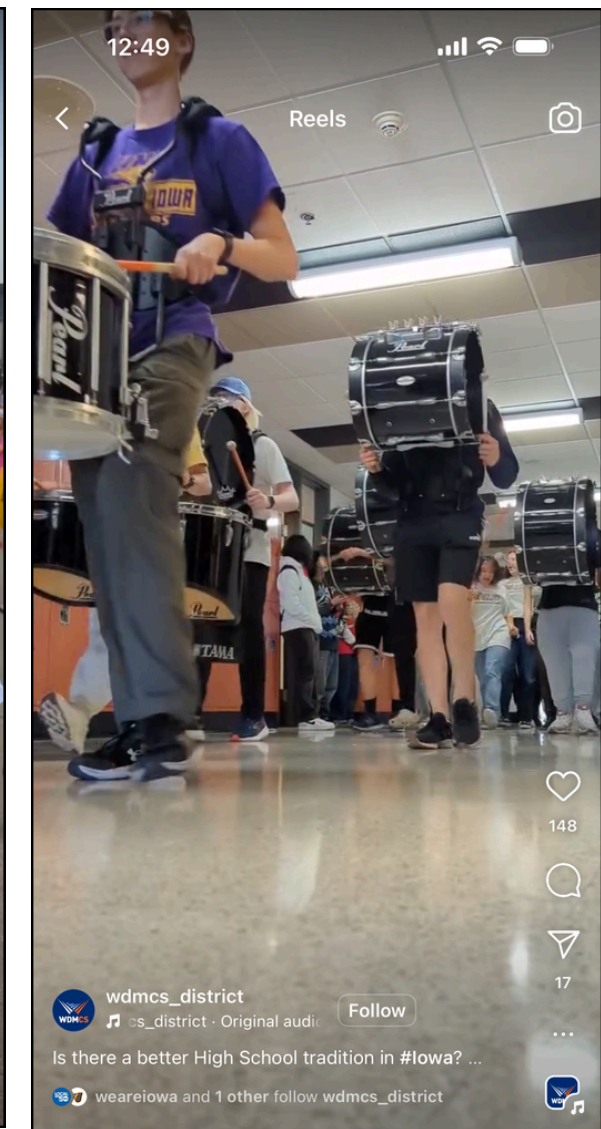
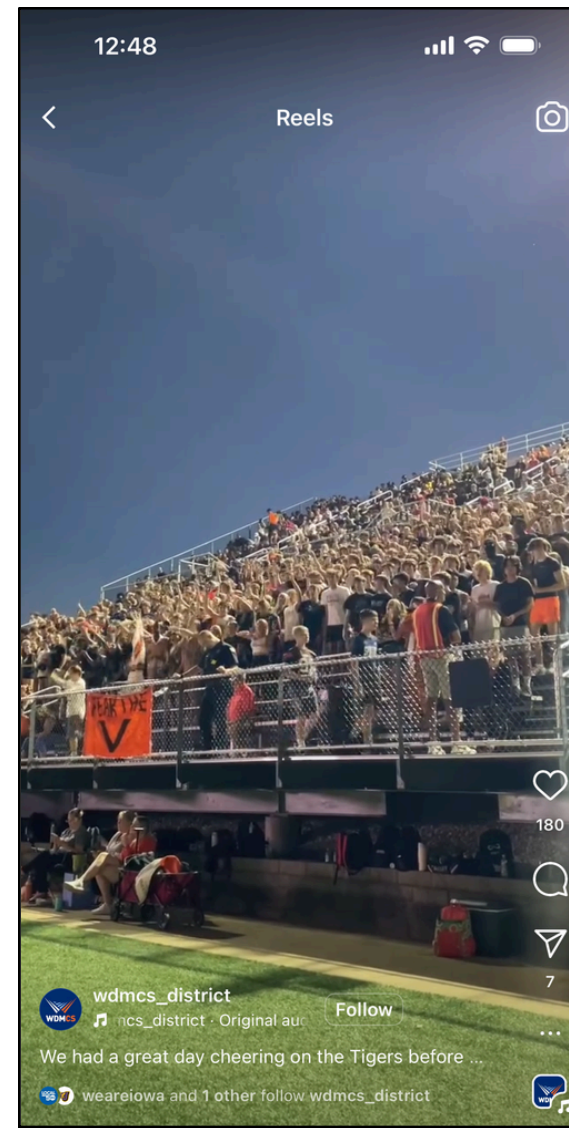
